Both delegates and observers will have speaking rights at the meeting, though delegates will have voting rights (as described below).*

*Those delegates representing a nation whose team has attended at least two of the previous three World Schools Debating Championships can vote on all matters.*

*Those delegates whose nation's teams have not attended at least two of the previous three World Schools Debating Championships (for example, new nations or nations who have been absent from more than two previous Championships) can vote in elections for sub-committees and on procedural matters, but may not vote on changes to the Rules.*
